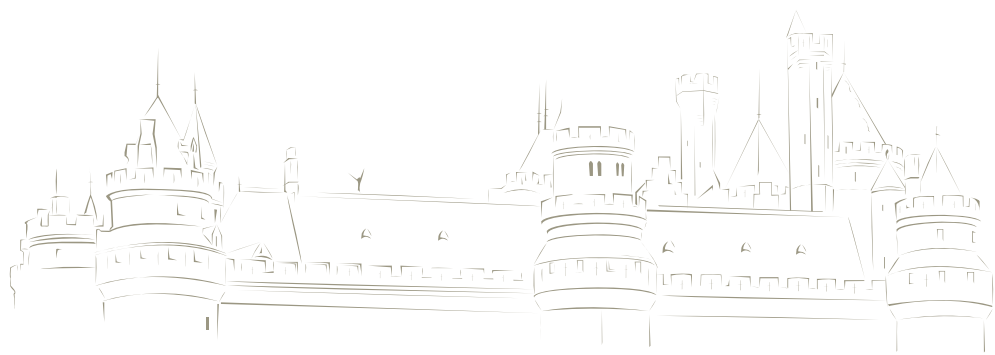

## THE CHÂTEAU DE PIERREFONDS



Built at the end of the 14th century by Louis I, Duke of Orléans, the castle was taken down in the 17th century and was in ruins when Napoleon III decided to entrust its reconstruction to the architect Eugène Viollet-le-Duc, who applied his architectural designs to make it look like the archetypal Middle Age castle.

## SAINT SULPICE CHURCH

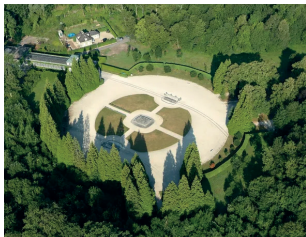


### *2 rue de l'église*

The Gothic-style church of Pierrefonds is under the patronage of Saint Sulpice of Bourges, which allows us to conclude that it was founded at the end of the Merovingian period.



## **THE GLADE OF THE ARMISTICE**



### ***Route de Soissons***

The Glade of the Armistice is the place where, France, its allies and Germany signed the armistice ending the war on 11 November 1918 in a train carriage, and also where France and the Third Reich signed the armistice on 22 June 1940.

## **SANCTUARY OF CHAMPLIEU**



Referred to as a Roman camp in documents dating back to the 16th century, the first official archaeological excavations of this ancient site were carried out in the 19th century, revealing part of the monumental centre of an ancient secondary settlement consisting of a temple, a theatre and baths.

## **SAINT-JEAN-AUX-BOIS AND ITS ABBEY CHURCH**



Saint-Jean-aux-Bois is one of the most beautiful villages in the Oise. It owes its existence to an abbey of Benedictine nuns founded in 1152 by Queen Adélaïde, the widow of Louis VI the Fat. The church, built in one fell swoop in the 1220s, is the only surviving part of the abbey, along with the older chapter house (circa 1170). It is a magnificent example of Gothic architecture.



## **ÉTANGS DE SAINT-PIERRE IN VIEUX-MOULIN**



Looking for some fresh air? For a picnic, a walk, an afternoon of photography or a day of fishing, the Saint-Pierre ponds are ideal, in any season. These three artificial ponds were dug by Celestine monks in the 16th century.

## **LA BREVIÈRE AND ÉTANG DE SAINTE-PÉRINE**



On this route through the Compiègne forest you will discover the charming village of Saint-Jean-aux-Bois, nominated one of the most beautiful villages in France, its abbey and, on a lovely easy walk through the forest, the village of La Brevière and the pond of Sainte-Périne.

## **THE CHATEAU DE COMPIÈGNE**



Built by Louis XV and Louis XVI, redesigned under Napoleon I and then Napoleon III, the Chateau de Compiègne was a centre of court life and the exercise of power. The originality and beauty of France's largest neoclassical château, the quality of its interiors and its furnishings make up a unique ensemble. This historic site is one of the three most important French royal and imperial residences, along with Versailles and Fontainebleau.
